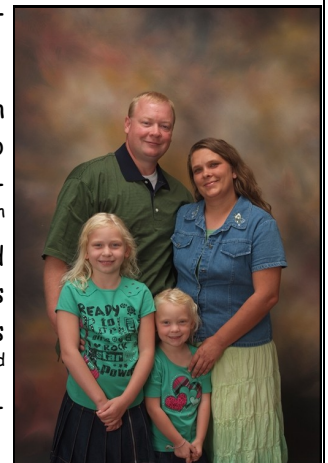

ELDERS' EDIFICATION AND ENCOURAGEMENT CORNER

The Model Prayer (Matt. 6:8-15)

One of the most important lessons that a Christian must learn is how to pray. We should not be surprised to learn that the disciples requested that Jesus teach them to pray (Luke 11:1). Jesus proceeded to give to them and to us a pattern for prayer and not primarily a prayer to be recited from memory. Jesus said, "In this manner, therefore pray." He did not say, "Pray these exact words, but pray like this." You may have heard the prayer in our text and in Luke 11:1-4 called the Lord's Prayer. The Lord's Prayer is found in John 17. The prayer in our text should more accurately be called "The Disciples' Prayer" or "The Model Prayer".

Another question arises regarding our praying to the heavenly Father. If prayer really is communing with God then how can a sinful human being, like me, approach a holy and just God? The answer to this question is found in the book of Hebrews: "Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus....let us draw near with a true heart in full assurance of faith..." (Heb. 10:19-22). We are invited to enter God's Sanctuary by the precious blood of Jesus Christ (John 14:6). Without Jesus Christ we are barred from approaching God and this means that prayer is for believers, those who have been washed in the blood of Christ (Eph. 1:7). A person cannot receive anything based on his or her own goodness. Therefore, let us know and rejoice that because of Jesus Christ we can draw near to God with a true heart in full assurance of faith that God will hear us.

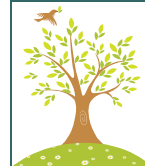

Taken from "Traditions of Men vs. the Word of God" by Alvin Jennings

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE TRADITION

8. Jesus Christ is not God, except in same sense that "God and man, Father and Son, are one in being." Science and Health, 36:12-18.
- He was not incarnated in the flesh: "The Virgin Mary conceived this idea of God and gave to her ideal the name of Jesus." Science and Health, 29:14-18.
 - Christ and Jesus are two: "Christ is the ideal truth; Jesus is the name of the man who more than all other men has presented Christ, the true idea of God... Jesus is the human man and Christ is the divine idea; hence the duality of Jesus the Christ." Science and Health, 475:10-17.
 - Jesus did not die. Science and Health, 46:2, 3; 44:28-29; 45:11-12.
 - Jesus did not rise from the dead physically. Science and Health, 313:26-30.

WORD OF GOD

8. Jesus is God. Isaiah 9:6; John 20:28; Philipians 2:5-6; Hebrews 1:8.
- Jesus became flesh. Luke 1:30-35; John 1:14; Luke 24:39.
 - Jesus is the Christ. Matthew 16:16-18.
 - The same person, in fleshly body. John 20:31; Romans 5:8; 1 Corinthians 15:3; 1 Peter 1:19; Ephesians 2:13-16.
 - A man is a liar (so is a woman!) who does not confess Jesus is the Christ, one and the same. 2 John 7.
 - Jesus Christ is come in the flesh 2 John 2:7.
 - He did die. John 19:33; Romans 5:8; 14:9; 15:3; 1 Corinthians 15:1-4; and many others.
 - He did arise physically. Luke 24:39-43; John 20:26-29.
 - We are saved from sin by the blood of Christ. Romans 5:9; Colossians 1:20; Hebrews 10:4-12; 1 John 1:7.
