
Sunday, November 2, 2014

ELDERS' EDIFICATION AND ENCOURAGEMENT CORNER

LET YOUR LIGHT SHINE

In a certain mountain village in Europe several centuries ago, a nobleman wondered what legacy he should leave to the people in his town. At last he decided to build them a church building.

No one saw the complete plans for the building until it was finished. When the people gathered, they marveled at its beauty and completeness. Then someone asked, "But where are the lamps? How will it be lighted?"

The nobleman pointed to some brackets in the walls. Then he gave to each family a candle which they were to bring with them each time they came to worship.

"Each time you are here the area where you are seated will be lighted," the nobleman said, "Each time you are not here, that area will be dark". This is to remind you that whenever you fail to come to church, some part of God's house will be dark."

Should we start giving out candles next Sunday? This is just a story but it has a stinging point. Those who seldom, if ever, attend worship or Bible study in the evening may be like those of whom it was said: *"the people living in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of the shadow of death a light has dawned."* (Matt. 4:16). That is, if they happened to see the church building in the evening from a distance.

Jesus also said, *"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house."* (Matt. 5:14-15). Attending all services of the church is letting your light shine -- after all, you come to worship God and study His word -- then leave to serve.

Maybe it would be good to pray, *"You, O Lord, keep my lamp burning; my God turns my darkness into light."* (Psalm 18:28).
