Fortunes Reversed

Following Jesus was not without difficulty. Sleeping arrangements could be less than comfortable. The treasurer was a thief. Jews were trying to kill you. To be Jesus' disciple you had to leave your old life behind. So yes, there were probably easier ways to go. You could be better off financially elsewhere. You could have a softer pillow by staying at home. Perhaps while thinking of some of these things Peter asks Jesus, "We have left everything to follow you! What then will there be for us?" (Matthew 19:27) In other words, we have become last in this life to be your disciples . . .what is our reward? And Jesus answers him by saying that Peter's reward would be great. He would, with the other apostles, sit on twelve thrones in His kingdom. He would have a position of great authority. Jesus teaches that anyone who makes sacrifices in this life to be His disciple would have his reward. And then He says: "But many who are first will be last, and many who are last will be first." (Matthew 19:30)

So many think that wealth is so important. Too many think that it's worth taking advantage of others to get it. So people struggle and fight to be just a little better off than their neighbors. Little do they know that acting selfishly doesn't improve your standing, it causes you to fall. Jesus says that if you want to be great you don't need to be greedy, you need to be a servant. He says if you want to be first you have to be willing to put yourself last. Luke 16 tells the story of Lazarus and the rich man. (By the way - I don't think it's wrong to be wealthy. Job was the richest man in the east. I just think it's wrong to be selfish.) Lazarus sat at the rich man's gate and longed to eat the scraps from the rich man's table. But apparently the rich man thought only of himself. Eventually they both die. Lazarus, who was last, becomes first. The rich man who had everything he wanted in this life becomes last. So what SEEMED so important in this life becomes not important at all.

Do you think people will respect you more if you become rich? They might. By becoming rich, beautiful, or powerful you may be favored by this world. In this life you may get put first. But I'm trying to tell you that first in this life is not a great place to be. Be humble church. Be a servant to all. Then God will call you great. "Instead, whoever wants to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wants to be first must be slave of all" (Mark 10:43-44)



Spending Minutes Wisely

Lord, make me to know my end. And what is the measure of the days. That I may know how frail I am indeed, you have made my days as handbreadths, and my age is nothing before you; certainly every man at his best state is but vapor.

Psalms 39:4-5

In Psalms 90, David shows his mindfulness of his time on earth. He asks God to help him number his days, which ought to be the prayer of everyone. Wise servants work to redeem the time they have.

We should often wander if the task is worth the time investment. What would happen if we were not doing it? Is there someone else who could do it just as well, and for whom the task would be time better spent? A good servant knows that time is like gold, and good "spending habits" are essential. It's just that in this case the units are minutes, not dollars.

If you don't know where your time goes-- that's a danger signal. If you can save small bits of time and consolidate them into chunks of time that can be spent on something worth-while—that's like "found money." If we can number our minutes and hours, "numbering our days" will be easier....
