#### Secret Good Deeds are Better

I believe that every one of us is capable of really good moments. Moments when you look back on what just happened and you say "I was part of a really good thing today". Our prayers go with Matt Perry and Cheryl Alt as they travel to take part in one of those moments. Bringing clean water to a place that has none - wow! What a good thing to do! And I think every one of us has opportunities to do good things. I think God makes sure that's true: "For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do" (Ephesians 2:10). So if you're doing what God made you to do then you'll take part in many good moments. You'll go to bed at night knowing your day was well spent and many people were blessed as you did God's work. All of this is wonderful.

However, there is a temptation that goes along with these good deeds. It's a temptation that the Pharisees and the teachers of the law gave in to regularly. When we do a good thing we often have a desire to proclaim what we did. (And not in a way that gives God the glory). Sometimes after we do a good thing we're tempted to boast. Sometimes we're tempted to pat ourselves on the back as we tell other people what a good job we did. And that is not a wise thing to do. "For it is not the one who commends himself who is approved, but the one whom the Lord commends" (2 Corinthians 10:18). If we praise ourselves for the good deeds we do, and should do, God will not be pleased. We don't do these good things for our own glory! We must do good deeds for the glory of God.

Make it your habit to keep many of the good things you do to yourself. Do not give into the temptation to tell people every good thing you have done. Speak more about all the good things that GOD is doing. Give Him the glory. And then I think you'll become "one whom the Lord commends." God's approval means so much more than whatever credit you might get from other people as you boast about all your good deeds.
