Mysterious Joy

Have you ever seen someone react in a way you didn't expect? Perhaps the situation called for one kind of reaction, but this person did something entirely different. You read about this kind of reaction in Acts 5. The apostles had been beaten because they just wouldn't stop talking about Jesus. I imagine that it hurt . . . a lot. Perhaps they were physically scarred for life from the flogging. Now what would you say is a normal reaction to that? Tears of grief and anger? Vengeful thoughts? Depression? Yes, these are the kind of things I would expect. But that's not what they did: "The apostles left the Sanhedrin, rejoicing because they had been counted worthy of suffering disgrace for the Name" (Acts 5:41). Wow! What a weird reaction to getting beaten.

The apostles had a joy that was not connected to their comfort in this world. In fact, their joy wasn't coming from anything in this world. And because that's true there will be a lot of people who can't understand how the apostles reacted to troubles. In fact, I still see this happen today. What do you expect when someone loses a loved one? Terrible, crushing, long lasting grief is what I would expect (normally). And yet we see Christians all the time who genuinely seem happy for the one who passed away. They have hope! Why? "Brothers, we do not want you to be ignorant about those who fall asleep, or to grieve like the rest of men, who have no hope" (1 Thessalonians 4:13). It's because they have hope! Christians have a joy that is not connected to this world. It's a reaction the world doesn't understand.

The Bible calls us to "be joyful always" (1 Thessalonians 5:16). I don't think that's possible if you're trying to get your joy from anything in this world. The things of the world come and go. There are times of plenty and times of want. There are times of sweet fellowship and times when people disappoint you. There are times of health and times of pain. If my joy is found in this world then I will only be joyful sometimes . . . if at all. But I'm told to be joyful ALWAYS. So my hope must be found in something that is always good and never changes. And so as Philippians 4:4 says I must "Rejoice in the Lord always".
