A story illustrates the need to be watchful. A flood was coming and the deputy was heard up and down the streets calling for people to leave their homes and find safety in higher ground. A lady remained in her house because she was confident the Lord would save her from the storm.

After a while the water was coming into the house and things were beginning to float, so she sat inside her upstairs window. A man in a boat came by and offered a ride, but she refused. "I know God will save me."

Soon the water was to the roof, and there she stood at its peak when a helicopter came to the rescue. She refused even that. God would save her.

After she drowned she had the opportunity to face the Lord and ask, "Why did you not save me?" He responded, "I sent the deputy, the man in the boat, and the helicopter."

The story is obviously fictional, but it makes a good point. Sometimes God sends us help in ways that we might not notice or even refuse to accept. Such was the case of a real person, Naaman, in 2 Kings 5. He had leprosy and was told to dip 7 times in the Jordan River to be healed. Because it was not what he expected, he refused the help, until a servant rebuked him.

How often do we miss God's blessings because they come in packages that we deem distasteful? Let us keep watch with eyes that look for fulfillment of the promises of God.
