WHAT SHOULD I GIVE?

We have all faced the agonizing choice of picking out a gift. We have baby showers, birthday parties, weddings, and many other occasions where a gift is a good idea. But what would they like? And how much should I spend? I know I can't afford to buy them a new car, but I also wouldn't want to show up with a gift that insults them. Wrapping up a popsicle stick from my kid's last treat probably isn't going to get the job done.

This is also a decision that we face every Sunday. You know the collection plate is going to go by, and it is your decision on what kind of financial gift you are going to give to God. How much thought have you put into this decision? I think this is a very BIG decision. What to give is a choice that is worthy of great consideration. This gift is much more important than what you bring to the wedding or the birthday party. Think of who you're giving to! The Lord, God Almighty, King of Kings. When you are bringing a gift before a king (and especially THE King) it is a good idea to consider whether or not the gift will please him.

The Bible says that it is your decision what to give to this King. He no longer requires a specific amount like He did in the law of Moses. You get to decide what to give, but that doesn't mean every gift is acceptable. Listen: "For if the willingness is there, the gift is acceptable according to what one has, not according to what he does not have" (2 Corinthians 8:12). A gift that is given out of obligation instead of love is not acceptable to the King. Our hearts must be right. And as you look as this verse you see that there is another qualification. God knows what we have and God sees what we give. How does your gift compare to what you have? If you truly have nothing God expects nothing. But what if we have a lot? I encourage you to consider these things so that your giving is pleasing to God.
