Be Careful Where You Go

There are some roads that the wise do not travel. There is an interesting passage in Proverbs chapter 7 where a father tells about something he saw while looking out his window. He says: "I saw among the simple, I noticed among the young men, a youth who lacked judgment" (Proverbs 7:7). I think the Bible teaches that there are a lot of traps you can fall into when you are young. In this case the trap is a married woman who is interested in the youth. Like Joseph demonstrated, that is a trap you want to stay FAR away from. But this unwise youth took a different approach: "He was going down the street near her corner, walking along in the direction of her house at twilight, as the day was fading, as the dark of night set in" (7:8-9). And at this point you want to reach through the pages and shake this boy. "Where do you think you're going? Don't go that way!" But he does, and he falls into the trap.

Maybe that seems very obvious to you. You KNOW that young man shouldn't have gone that way. Perhaps you saw that trap coming a mile away. If so, I am glad. I'm glad you can see that outside of the right way there are many traps that can catch you and hurt you. I am, however, reminded of people who have said "well, I never thought this would happen to me." I personally know some people who thought they could walk down the same path without getting caught or hurt in any way. We need to be wiser than that! There is ONE right road to be on - the narrow road, following Jesus. Outside of this road there are traps all over the place. And "If they have escaped the corruption of the world by knowing our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and are again entangled in it and overcome, they are worse off at the end than they were at the beginning" (2 Peter 2:20). Did you catch that? Outside of where you should be you can get "entangled." And can you imagine that being "entangled" might make it hard to get back on the right road? I can.

This is one reason why I love the church so much. When you're at a church that teaching truth it is easier to stay on the right road. Here I am surrounded by people who want me to stay on the right road. People are praying that I do. People are nudging me back on that road when I veer off course. I'm at a church that encourages me week after week and that encouragement helps me stay away from being entangled by traps. This week I want to encourage you to ALWAYS be at a church that highlights the right road to be on. Or in other words, ALWAYS be at a church that follows God's Word.
