Mercy Triumphs

I encourage you to take a moment and marvel at God's grace. If you're a Christian the gates of heaven have been open to you, even though you know you don't deserve it. No offense - I don't deserve it. Or anything close. Think about one of those fancy roped off New York clubs. You know, the ones your name has to be on the list to get in. What are the odds you'd be able to get in there, to meet the celebrities and eat the fancy food? I wouldn't like my chances. So why would God take me, someone relatively unknown in the world, and offer me a home with Him? Why would He let me enter a place a million times better than anything found on Earth? Doesn't He know what I've done? He does, and still God calls me to come home. Such is the grace of God.

If God did not forgive then I would have nothing. As Peter once said to Jesus: "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life" (John 6:68). Apart from God there is nowhere else to go. If God will not accept me then nothing matters. So how wonderful is it that God is gracious enough to pick me up when I have fallen down? How great that God is willing to reach WAY down to show me mercy! This is too great to understand. All I can do is marvel. And as I stand here marveling God says to me in His Word: "I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you" (John 13:15).

I live among people who make mistakes. I worship with people who make mistakes. And I make plenty of them myself. When someone falls into error I think God wants me to do my best to set them straight. But then, after the wrong has been corrected, I am called to forgive and comfort: "Now instead, you ought to forgive and comfort him, so that he will not be overwhelmed by excessive sorrow" (2 Corinthians 2:7). I am to do for others what God has done for me. That way, through the example of the church, all people will see that God forgives mistakes. It would be a great victory for God if we all follow His example in this way. And it would be a great victory for the devil if we don't.
