Let Me Fondly Dream

Paul says: "Meanwhile we groan, longing to be clothed with our heavenly dwelling" (2 Cor. 5:2). Groaning isn't contentment. This is something Paul wanted, and he wanted it over any earthly goal.

There are many blessings that God has given us in this world. Because of all these blessings this world can be a wonderful place sometimes. But HERE is not THERE. Earth is not heaven. And until we are in heaven I think we should feel like we are missing something. We should dream, and dream often, of the time when were are where we prefer to be. 
