### THE WONDERFUL GIFT OF GOD

What makes a good gift a good gift? Let's be honest here - you probably weren't super thrilled with every gift you have received. Perhaps some gifts discretely became someone else's gift. Or maybe you took a couple back to Wal-Mart. On the other hand, for some gifts that would be out of the question. Why? Why do you love certain gifts? Maybe it is because the gift is valuable. You wanted it but you wouldn't have (or couldn't have) bought it for yourself. Maybe it is because the gift is useful. It fulfills a practical need in your life. Maybe the gift is long-lasting. (After all, if your gift breaks ten minutes after you open it that's not going to be your favorite gift). And maybe the gift is none of those things but you know the giver gave it out of love so you love the gift anyway.

The gift of God is all of these things. It is valuable. More valuable than everything you have. "The kingdom of heaven is like treasure hidden in a field. When a man found it, he hid it again, and then in his joy went and sold all he had and bought that field" (Matthew 13:44). This gift of God is useful. "I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes" (Romans 1:16). The gift is long lasting. Really long lasting. "Provide purses for yourselves that will not wear out, a treasure in heaven that will not be exhausted, where no thief comes near and no moth destroys" (Luke 12:33). And we can certainly know that the gift of God was given out of love. "For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16).

What will your response be to being given such a wonderful, powerful gift? I remember when I was a kid, if I really loved the gift, I would check the tag and write that person a nice thank-you letter. Well, I wrote a thank-you letter for every gift because my mom made me. But if I loved the gift I really meant it! I suggest no less for the gift of God. Tell God thank you. Tell Him every day. His gift is that good.
