Living a righteous life can be hard. Christians are called, in view of God's mercy, to "offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God - this is your spiritual act of worship" (Romans 12:1). Being a "living sacrifice" means that you have to climb back on the altar again and again. That requires a lot of motivation. Where can this motivation be found? Sometimes we can find it through a healthy kind of fear. After all, Christians know something about the future that IS scary if you're not living well. "For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive what is due him for the things done while in the body, whether good or bad. Since, then, we know what it is to fear the Lord . . ." (2 Cor. 5:10-11). We know our actions will be judged! Does that motivate you to avoid what is evil and cling to what is good? Well, maybe. Judgment should motivate us. But sometimes it feels like it's a long way away. Fear CAN fuel us, but something else works better.

Thinking about the coming judgment is not a bad idea. Thinking about how much Jesus loves you is an even better one. If it weren't for Jesus we would all be condemned. We are all guilty so we would all be punished. But I encourage you to think about what Jesus did on the cross. Think about what he gave up. Think about how He could have been a king and instead He was a servant. Think about how Jesus could have had angels guard him so that He never even accidentally struck His foot against a stone. And then think about what Jesus choose to do on that cross. Realize that He did this so on the Day of Judgment you could be found innocent. THAT is our BEST fuel. "For Christ's love compels us, because we are convinced one died for all" (2 Cor. 5:14).

What difference would it make in your life if you grasped the love of Christ? What would it change? I simply cannot believe that it would change nothing. His love is too great. Set your mind to understanding this love and you will have all the motivation you need.


