## A Message Worth Fighting

We've all made this decision many times. Someone says something that you know is wrong and you're faced with a choice: "Do I say something to try and teach them better or do I let it go?" We all know "that guy" who feels the need to correct everything. We don't want to be "that guy." But when should we be "that guy"? I think there are a couple of considerations. First: am I in a position where I am supposed to be educating? If one of my kids says the moon is ten miles away I will probably correct them, because as a parent I am one of their educators. If I overhear a stranger telling his friend the moon is ten miles away I would probably ignore it. My second consideration is: how dangerous is the message? If you don't know the moon is about 239,289 miles from earth that's not the end of the world. I would be much more concerned if someone didn't know how to get to heaven.

Let's say I run across those same two strangers. One of them asks the other - "So how do you get to heaven?" His friend then says, "Well, I watched the religious channels a bit. I think you have to say a prayer and give some money to the church." If, for some reason, I overheard this conversation I would feel compelled to stop and introduce myself. I imagine myself saying something like: "I think that's one of the most important questions you can ask. I would love to have a Bible study with you to show you what God's answer is." I would do this because of how dangerous the message they heard is. That is a message worth fighting.

In Jeremiah's day dangerous messages were being spread among the people. The false teachers "keep saying to those who despise me, 'The Lord says: You will have peace.' And to all who follow the stubbornness of their hearts they say, "No harm will come to you" (Jeremiah 29:17). This message is dangerous because it discourages the people from repenting. So Jeremiah fought it, telling the people what God really said. Church, we are God's ambassadors and we are called to fight against the wisdom of this age (see 1 Corinthians 3:18-20). There is a time for minding our own business and there is a time for speaking up. I pray we all have the wisdom to know which is which.


