When to be Immovable

I think Christianity is a religion that, at times, values compromise. We are called to be a peace loving people. We are called to consider the interests of others and not just our own. And scripture also says: "Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ" (Ephesians 5:21). That means there will be times when I let other people have their way. There will be times when I put up with a lot for the cause of Christ. After all, people getting to heaven is MUCH more important than any personal preference I may have.

That being said, I also think Christianity is a religion that, at times, requires us to not compromise one bit. There are some things that we shouldn't put up with. Paul said to the Corinthian church: "For if someone comes to you and preaches a Jesus other than the Jesus we preached, or if you receive a different spirit from the one you received, or a different gospel from the one you accepted, you put up with it easily enough" (2 Corinthians 11:4). This is not a good thing. I think Paul is saying here that there are some things that we shouldn't put up with. Let's say someone started teaching that Jesus didn't really perform miracles, and that those stories in the Bible were mythology. (This is taught in some churches.) Should we put up with that? Should we accept a Jesus without divine power? Or what if someone taught that the gospel is obeyed by praying a prayer, and nothing else? (MANY churches teach this.) Should we put up with that here? I think the answer is no. Instead we should kindly and clearly state that this church stands with the Bible.

Sometimes it can be hard to see how "if someone strikes you on the cheek, turn to him the other also" (Matt. 5:39) and Ephesians 6:13's goal of "standing your ground" work together. The answer comes from knowing when I can compromise and when I can't. There are a lot of things I can and should give up if it will be a blessing to someone else. And there are times when following the example of Jesus means I will not fight back. But I can NEVER compromise on God's Word. Not one inch. I can never put up with someone teaching my brothers and sisters in Christ a different gospel. Compromising here helps no one. So let's wear God's armor and stand!


