#### Love is Committed

In every wedding that I've ever been to or officiated there have been vows made. The bride and groom look one another in the eyes and make promises of faithfulness and commitment. "I'll be there for you no matter what." "You're the only one for me for as long as we live." Things like that. And I think this is a good thing. I think commitment is an important part of love. What kind of love do we have if we are devoted to someone one day and care nothing for them the next? What kind of love do we have when we are kind when things are going well but inconsiderate when they are not? That's a very weak kind of love if it's love at all.

Perhaps this helps us think about Deuteronomy 6:5: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength." How do I live this out? How do I love God more? One answer is that we can choose to become more committed. Perhaps our commitment to God is good when we have what we want, and we doubt him when troubles come. Or maybe it's the reverse: we seek God when we are in trouble and ignore him when we aren't. Either way, I would encourage us all to be committed to God all day, every day. Our love for Him cannot be dependent on how our day is going.

Why not take a moment right now and make a decision? I encourage you to speak these words to God: "Lord, I will love you no matter what." Whether you are swimming in blessings or everything is taken from you love the Lord. When Job lost it all he said: "The Lord gave and the Lord has taken away; may the name of the Lord be praised" (Job 1:21). Do we have that kind of commitment to our Lord? To worship Him in good times and bad? If not, let's decide today that this is the kind of love we are going to have from this day forward. Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength . . . all the time.





John 3:17




