Faith + Love = Service

One option for meeting energy needs is to put solar panels on your home. They soak in the sun and provide power to your refrigerator and your hair dryer. And sometimes, perhaps on a really sunny day, they create so much energy that you cannot use it all. Then you have a surplus that you can sell back to the energy company for other people to use. This causes much rejoicing as you thank God for the sun. I think this is a useful image for picturing the love and blessings of God. As I turn my heart toward God I realize that He loves me. Not because I am deserving but because He is merciful. I then thank God for the Son. This, in fact, is so much love that on good days I find myself content and thankful. There is love to spare when we allow God to fill our hearts in this way. Listen to this prayer: "May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as ours does for you" (1 Thessalonians 3:12).

When you love God and you realize God loves you there is a surplus. There is overflow. I think those who follow the greatest command (love God) will soon be naturally following the second greatest command (love others). The love of God spills over into love of others. And this love becomes visible in people's lives through acts of service. So I ask: do you know how much God loves you? Do you know He sent His Son to redeem you? Do you realize what Jesus has given you an opportunity to have? We serve because we love God. We also serve because we believe that our service will be rewarded. "Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain" (1 Corinthians 15:58). Because of your faith, and out of surplus of love, I encourage you to commit to serving God (and others) in 2017.


