Be Careful Little Eyes

I love it when timeless truths are expressed in children's songs. Have you ever heard the one with the lyric "be careful little eyes what you see"? Other verses tell our ears to have selective hearing and our feet to choose their paths wisely. I'm glad this song is taught to children because I'm sure they will save themselves so much trouble if they just head its advice. We should do the same. We should pray: "Turn my eyes away from worthless things; preserve my life according to your Word" (Psalm 119:37). Perhaps we shouldn't literally have a conversation with our eyeballs as the song suggests, but you get the idea. Resolve to be careful about what you choose to look at, and listen to, and be in the presence of. David, in a weak moment, wasn't careful about where he looked. Near the end of his life King Saul wasn't careful about who he listened to. Balaam wasn't careful about where he went. These decisions did not turn out well.

If we guard our ears and eyes then we are also guarding our heart. This is something the Bible considers very important: "Above all else, guard your heart, for it is the wellspring of life" (Proverbs 4:23). There is no question that what is going on around us makes an impact on who we are. Consider this verse: "He who walks with the wise grows wise, but a companion of fools suffers harm" (Proverbs 13:20). And why? Those who walk with the wise see wise things. They hear wise things. And this wisdom travels through the eyes and ears into the heart, changing who we are. Or you can spend time seeing and hearing foolish things. but this foolishness will make the same heart bound trip.

Church, think about what you watch on television. Think about what movies you choose to see (and take your kids to). Think about what you read. Think even about who your closest friends are and what kind of influence they have on you. I suggest surrounding yourself with what is good and wholesome and pure. "Be careful little eyes what you see." We do this to achieve the goal that Jesus has set before us: "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God" (Matthew 5:8). If your eyes don't see it, and your ears don't hear it, then it will never get into your heart. So place the Word of God before your eyes and let it direct what else you choose to see.



Proverb 22:1 "A sterling reputation is better than striking it rich."


Some food for thought!
