Mercy Triumphs

How much would you enjoy being a presiding judge? You get a lofty title: "your honor." If you've watched Judge Judy at all you know you have the opportunity to publically assess other people's intelligence. Would you like that? Would you like dropping the hammer on the miscreants and traffic violators of the world? Discipline is surely necessary at times to promote the common good, but my question is: would you enjoy being the one who doles it out? Maybe. There is something in us that loves to see wrongdoers get what they deserve. But I hope there is also something in us that loves to pardon and forgive. Luke 6:36 says "Be merciful, just as your Father is merciful."

Only a few people judge professionally. Many judge in their spare time. We look at people every day and determine whether or not they are worthy of our kindness. (This may be a subconscious decision but it happens). We decide whether or not someone is worth compassion and patience. And when evil or insult is done to us we decide whether to return it with insult or with blessing. The Bible encourages one choice over the other: "Finally, all of you, live in harmony with one another; be sympathetic, love as brothers, be compassionate and humble. Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because to this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing" (1 Peter 3:8-9).

We need to consider how much mercy God has given us. When we deserved punishment by death God gave us a pardon through Jesus. We owned a debt we could not pay and it was canceled. Should that not affect how we treat others? As Christians our actions should reflect the nature of God. "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you" (Ephesians 4:32). I encourage you to commit to loving mercy. Love the mercy that God has given you and love sharing this mercy with others.


