May Our Neighbors Be Saved

I have a neighbor who seems like a nice guy. I don't know him really well, I just talk to him in passing sometimes. I know that he watches his grandkids fairly often to help his children out. I've seen him outside fixing his car, so I think he has those skills. I joked with him "I know who to ask the next time my car has a problem." And he was kind and said "yeah, I can do that." His wife leaves for work about the same time I do and she always returns my "good morning." (I don't give her a good morning with quite the same level of enthusiasm I give the church a good morning see Proverbs 27:14). So, all things considered, they're nice people. But I also am pretty sure that they don't go to church on Sunday. Nice people, but you probably wouldn't consider them Christian people.

There is a decision to be made here. They seem to be nice people leading moral lives. They have probably lived the way they are living for years. Is "nice people" enough? Should I assume that since they watch their grandchildren they must be okay with God? And if not is there anything that I should do, given the opportunity? If you know your Bible you know the answers to these question. First of all, nice is NOT good enough to please God. Jesus says: "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me" (John 14:6). You must be a Christian to be saved. You have to be in Christ and you must be obedient to God's will. And to answer the second question there is absolutely something I should do. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-20). I should, for starters, try to encourage my neighbor to be a disciple of Jesus.

Now, the guy didn't seem thrilled when I told him I was a preacher. Perhaps he has no interest in spiritual things. But I could use your prayers. Pray God gives me the courage to take each and every opportunity to share my faith in Jesus. Pray for my neighbor that God may move his heart to desire to study the Bible and find out what it says about salvation. And pray for all in the church that God might send more workers out into the fields. There are people out there who are ready to accept the gospel! All they need is someone to tell them. I pray that someone is you.




